entrants. It makes for a long day, but it increases our entries. The Friday show will likely start earlier so it
won't end so late.

#### AKC Scent Work Trial - Feb. 17 - 18

- SSCNC's first AKC Scent Work Trial took place on the weekend of February 17-18 at Sycamore Lane Kennel.
- While there were issues with the weather and the site, the event was successful.
- John got lots of compliments and "Thank You's" from competitors.
- Having two trials in one day was a big draw. It enabled competitors to finish a title in a weekend.
- We had lots of SSCNC members volunteering. Patsi said that it was more members volunteers than we
  usually get for an agility trial.
- John looks forward to doing another Trial (but more efficiently).
- Thanks to John or Kim for putting the event together!

#### March 31 2024 Specialty

- We are holding our March Specialty at Sycamore Lane Kennels with the SacValley Sheltie Club. SacValley is Saturday, March 30<sup>th</sup> and we are Sunday, March 31<sup>st</sup>.
- Karen talked to Pam Strametz (her partner, Dale Root) is the Trial Secretary.
  - o 2 weeks before closing, we have 11 conformation entries in the am, and 9 in the pm.
  - o We have 18 obedience entries and 20 rally entries (Obedience & Rally are open to the herding group this has helped with our numbers).
- Entries close March 13<sup>th</sup>.
- Rebecca said that she had tentative plans to set up a Spring themed photo booth at the show (since March 31<sup>st</sup> is Easter) – weather permitting. The photo booth will be free to use and will have Spring/Easter themed props and background.

<u>Trophies</u>: Gale called Cindy. She isn't sure what she wants yet.

<u>Trophies</u>: Mark sent an email to Terry plus the Premium List. He also booked the ribbons for October.

#### October Specialties:

- Beginning October 2025, the Obedience & Rally portion of the October Specialty will take place at another time and location (TBD) due to the difficulties of holding an outdoor event at Dixon. This may be a standalone event.
- We are committed to having Obedience & Rally at the Dixon Specialty in October 2024 because we already have a judge (Nancy Craig).
- The Board proposed replacing Sweeps with Best Puppy at the October Specialty. This is due to the large number of shows taking place at Dixon (tiring for puppies). It also brings us in line with the SacValley Club.
  - o Motion by Mark: Starting October 2025, Sweeps will be replaced by Best Puppy (this will only happen at the October show March will still have Sweeps). Seconded and Approved by the membership.

#### Website:

- The website is set to go live on March 1.
- Lisa C. met with the web designer, Lisa Smyth, a couple of weeks ago. She has also taken some tutorials on how to manage the website.
- All links are connected. Lisa S. is working on connecting PayPal. Membership is setup up.
- There will be printable forms. The membership application will be available online.
- The members only section will be for members in good standing.
- Lots of new information is on the website. It has taken 6 months to build!

#### **New Business:**

- Nominating Committee:
  - o We need to form a Nominating Committee for 2024 Board and Officers. The Committee consists of the Chair, 2 Board members and 2 regular members.
  - o So far, the Committee consists of Bev Fadden (Chair), Yvonne and Mark (Board representatives) and Linda Morrison (regular membership).
  - o At the meeting, Tina Laster volunteered to be the final member of the committee.
  - o The slate of 2024-5 SSCNC Officers and Board will be presented at the May 2024 meeting, with voting in June.
- Obedience and Rally Chairs: Starting after the October 2024 Specialty, Roxayn King will be the SSCNC Obedience Chair and Bev Fadden will be the SSCNC Rally Chair.
- Sweeps Prizes: Rachael recommended changing our policy for Sweeps awards so we don't use coins and round to the nearest whole dollar instead. Issue tabled until we can discuss the Sweeps prize structure further.

#### Old Business:

- Bylaws:
  - o Mark received a response from the AKC (Ann) regarding the new SSCNC Bylaws.
  - o Overall the AKC thinks the new Bylaws are good; they are just asking for a few tweaks, then they will approve.
  - o Big thanks to Mark, also John, Cindy and Karen.
- AKC Membership List:
  - o One of the AKC's requirements regarding the Bylaws is that we need to send a current membership list. We have not submitted a membership list in several years. Technically, the AKC requires clubs to send in their membership lists annually. Mark has put together a list to submit to the AKC.
- IRS Issue:
  - o Kathy C. asked about the status of the IRS issue.
  - o Rachael said that the law firm is at a loss because IRS is refusing to accept our tax filings or even give us any information. She is not getting anywhere with phone calls to the IRS.
  - Rachael is going to send in a 990 form plus an explanation. According to what she has read, this tactic may result in updating and re-activating our EIN and force the IRS to deal with us.

# Shetland Sheepdog Club of Northern California, Inc. CODE OF ETHICS

#### INTRODUCTION:

Whether an owner, exhibitor, or breeder, the Shetland Sheepdog enthusiast is often confronted with decisions and courses of action which can impact the continued improvement and preservation of the breed, and the well-being of his or her individual dogs. All too often, because of inexperience or lack of forethought, the decisions made and the courses of action pursued are unfortunate ones, with lasting detrimental effects.

With the following voluntary guidelines, which represent a composite of the personal codes of conduct and concerns of its members, the Shetland Sheepdog Club of Northern California, Inc., is setting forth acceptable practices and a number of precautions for its members as well as any and all involved with our breed.

#### BREEDING CONSIDERATIONS:

It is important that breeders examine their motives before undertaking any breeding. While the zeal to produce champions is understandable, the breeder must guard against becoming insensitive to the lives produced; must understand the costs in time and money; and must recognize the difficulties in placing unwanted offspring in caring homes.

- A. Breeding should be done selectively with the intention of reducing faults to a minimum and producing healthy Shelties of high quality, type, and proper temperament.
- B. Breeding should be undertaken only when the breeder is in a position to properly care for the bitch and litter. The breeder should recognize it may be necessary to house offspring for a considerable length of time, and be prepared to provide suitable facilities during this time.
- C. No fancier should attempt breeding until able to distinguish between the correct and the incorrect. Such ability presupposes careful study of the breed standard, the basic principles of genetics, and the pedigrees of prospective mates.
- D. Breeders should breed only stock which is in good health and which is physically and temperamentally sound. No dog or bitch should be bred that is known to have, or is suspected of having, any serious inheritable defects or diseases.
- E. The stud dog should be bred selectively. The owner should discourage the individual who wants to breed pet quality bitches, or one unsuitable for their stud. The stud dog owner should be certain the owner of the bitch has the necessary knowledge and facilities to care for the puppies.
- F. Only dogs which are free from all discoverable, and assumed hereditary, defects should be used for breeding. "Discoverable" under present circumstances includes those forms of blindness whose incipient stages can be detected via competent eye exam, joint diseases such as hip dysplasia, that are revealed through x-ray study, cryptorchidism or monorchidism that can be found by palpitation, and any other gross and obvious abnormality, such as heart defects or serious skeletal defects.
- G. The Orthopedic Foundation of America (OFA) and Canine Eye Registration Foundation (CERF) certification procedures are recommended as useful measures for detection of defects.
- H. Individuals which themselves have been examined and checked out "clear", but which are direct parents or close relatives of afflicted dogs, should be regarded as relatively "high risk" breeding stock.
- I. All contracts on co-ownerships, breeding rights, or repeat breedings, should contain a clause voiding them or otherwise providing terms of settlement without breedings, if a dog involved is, subsequent to the date of original contract, found to be "afflicted" or definitely "high risk".

#### **SELLING AND SALES CONTRACTS:**

Problems resulting from sales and sales agreements are perhaps the greatest source of dissatisfaction and ill will in the breed. It is important the seller be honest with himself and the buyer. It is equally important all agreements and stipulations be recorded in written sales contracts.

- A. Sales prices of dogs and puppies should be based on the observable quality of the individual dog as potential show or breeding specimens.
- B. No puppy should be released or shipped to a new home before the age of eight weeks.
- C. Ethical breeders do not consign their dogs to pet stores, animal brokers, or commercial kennels, and do not donate them as prizes for any raffle or contest.
- D. A breeder must be discriminating in the placement of his stock and should not knowingly deal with unethical persons. A breeder should not sell to, or aid in selling a Sheltie to any person whom he has reason to believe will not provide the proper care and environment, or who may use the dog in a fashion which is detrimental to the breed.
- E. The new owners should be provided with at least a three-generation pedigree, an inoculation record and booster due dates. Novice buyers should also be provided with a thorough written list of instructions on diet and care.
- F. Breeding arrangements should never be established which would encourage the pet buyer to undertake a breeding program.
- G. Each person who sells or places a dog should provide the new owner with a registration application, a signed transfer, or a signed agreement between buyer and seller as described in the American Kennel Club rules (Chapter 3). It is recommended a sales contract be executed for every sale.
- H. Breeders and sellers should make themselves familiar with laws and regulations intended to protect the pet buying public. Puppy buyers have a right to a sound, healthy pet that is representative of the breed. Breeders and/or sellers should be responsible for providing certain refunds, replacements or reimbursements, should the dog they sell become ill or die from a condition contracted prior to the purchase.

#### GENERAL RECOMMENDATIONS:

- A. Dog owners have a responsibility to their canine companions to provide proper care and humane treatment at all times. Proper care and humane treatment include an adequate and nutritious diet, clean water, clean comfortable living conditions, regular veterinary care, kind and responsive human companionship, and training for appropriate behavior. Dogs should not be kept in circumstances or numbers where all of these needs cannot be adequately fulfilled.
- B. Breeders should encourage puppy purchasers to have their pets spayed or neutered to prevent accidental breeding, and to avoid breeding merely to produce puppies for monetary gain.
- C. All breeders must keep accurate and thorough breeding records in accordance with AKC requirements.


