

- In 2026, our trial dates will revert back to our usual weekend. •



<u>COMMON MEDICAL ISSUES IN SHETLAND SHEEPDOGS</u> Part II

GALLBLADDER MUCOCELES

Gallbladder mucoceles in shelties is becoming a more frequently recognized health problem in older dogs. The ASSA and the AKC Canine Health Foundation have spent hundreds of thousands of dollars in research to try to determine the causes of this fatal disease. As of now, this disease can be fatal to approximately 40% of untreated cases.

There are known to be three main causes of GB mucoceles:

 metabolic abnormalities- such as hypothyroid, high fat levels in the blood, Cushing's Disease, and abnormal urinary protein loss
environmental toxins

3. inflammation

Common clinical signs are:

- high triglycerides, cholesterol, and elevated liver enzymes in the blood
- diarrhea,
- vomiting,
- decrease in appetite

Diagnosis: ultrasound

Treatment: This can be life-threatening and the best treatment is to surgically remove the gallbladder before it ruptures


